Whereas, this day provides an opportunity to experience immense personal growth while preserving our state's longstanding tradition of neighbor helping neighbor; and


Whereas, the residents of West Virginia will join with the residents of Virginia, Maryland and Washington, DC to participate in the regional Day to Serve.
